Come along to our Bright Sparks STEM Fair at Leicester Grammar School on Saturday 17 June 2023, between 10am and 3pm. This is a free event, specifically aimed at pupils within the Trust, but also open to the general public, aimed to excite pupils about STEM subjects.

Our last Big Bang Fair in 2019 (pre Covid!) was a resounding success, with over 3000 visitors joining us over the course of the day, to experience a wide range of 60 different hands-on exhibits. This year promises to be bigger and better than ever; highlights being a tethered hot air balloon, a chance to perform key-hole surgery with the Medical Mavericks and race against Usain Bolt in the 25m Accelerator Tube, the opportunity to meet a variety of animals with Wild Science and explore the solar system in Warwick University's 360° Planetarium! We have booked over 70 exhibitors from local businesses, Universities and STEM

organisations, so it promises to be a fantastic day out for all ages.
