#### Cross-Country report:

LGJS had 22 dedicated cross-country runners racing at Mallory Park on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> October. The weather was calm and it wasn't too chilly, however after storm Babat the week before which brought lots of rain, the underfoot conditions were soft, wet and muddy!

The Yr3s had a strong turnout, with the girls first to take on the tough, 1.1km undulating course. Valerie ran confidently, showing great stamina to finish in a strong 13<sup>th</sup> place. She was followed by Mathilde (35th), Ida (36th), Zuri (41st), Sienna D (42nd) and Kayanna (66th), out of a field of 88 runners. The Yr3 boys team ran the same course, Oscar Wright racing competitively to 47th, supported by Issac Li (68th), Harry D (80th) and Issac E-W (104th), out of 133 runners.

Yr4 only had two representatives (who would love some teammates for the next two league races). Sienna P showed her consistency in always finishing at the front end of a cross country field. She paced herself brilliantly over the 1.3km race, to finish 16<sup>th</sup> out of 82 runners. Arushan worked hard throughout his race, showing great awareness on the course. He finished 120<sup>th</sup> out of 159 runners - the largest race of the day!

Next up were Yr5 who ran a hilly 1.6km course! Aditi always runs with great determination in cross country, and finish in 47th. Following closely behind, was the ever improving and committed Sasha Patel, finishing 66<sup>th</sup> out of 99 runners. The Yr4 boys followed, with Ethan McNally storming to a strong 11<sup>th</sup> place finish. He was targeting a top 10 finish, but must be proud to be so competitive and close to the leaders. William H took the race on and ran strongly in 57th, followed by Ted North in a solid 78<sup>th</sup> and Trinay in 86th, out of 111 finishers.

Yr6 were last to race, but eager to impress. Kirrily went out on mission from the start line, leading every step of the way and building her lead throughout the 2km race. She paced herself so well, speeding to a comfortable victory and shiny gold medal! Boni worked hard over the challenging course, finishing 58<sup>th</sup> out of 73 runners. The last race of the morning, Yr6 boys had the roughest ground to contend with. Philip pushed himself the whole way, racing to a strong 14<sup>th</sup> place, along with Jaimin who also ran to a super 36<sup>th</sup> out of 77 runners.

A big well done to all the pupils to took part and thank you to the parents who supported on the day.
