Roman Day!

Year 3 had the most fantastic Roman experience day on Thursday.

We began our day by meeting the Roman centurion. He showed us around his camp and explained what he wore, ate, and did each day. Then Aida and Miss Hart tried on some Roman armour. Theo also tested his strength- trying to break some wood the same thickness as Roman and Celtic shields. Then we had a chance to experience life in the centurion's camp. We learned how to write in Latin on wax boards. We also played some Roman games and practised cleaning ourselves with olive oil! Then we helped clean the centurion's armour with oil and took turns trying on the Roman armour. After that we learned how to fire a catapult and how to grind some grains to make flour for the bread.

After lunch we had the opportunity to handle some real Roman artefacts. We discussed what we thought they were, which was a bit tricky at times!



to eat food cooked by a Roman centurion again. Not all of us liked it, but some of us thought it wasn't too bad!




World Book Day






























Art

Royal Academy of Arts - Young Artists' Summer Show web link:

Is your child 4 years old and over? Does your child love art: drawing, painting, photography or sculpture? Then this is the competition for them!

If they win their artwork could be exhibited at The Royal Academy of Arts Summer Show in London?

How can they enter?

Submitting artwork is completely free and online.

We have registered LGJS with the competition, so the children can now enter their artwork with help from a parent or adult at home.

As a parent you need to register with your email address and password via the web link above.

Once you have logged in you need to select Leicester Grammar School Trust from the school drop down box.

Each child can submit artwork of any type and there is no theme.

When they enter, the website asks for photographs of your child's artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and a little information about the artwork and why they made it.

What kind of artworks do they accept?

The artwork can be made using any medium (a word for the materials they've used to create their art)

It can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, drawing, or a combination.

There is no theme so artworks can be about any subject.

The last couple of weeks have been in the music department have been incredibly busy.

The audience were able to watch the full range of ability from students beginning their woodwind journey on recorder and toot, to young adults in the 6th form treating us to flute sonatas. Our flute groups, soloists and duets were professional and musical in their performances and all performers conducted themselves beautifully throughout the evening.




The Piano recital was on 9th February and the Instrumental Recital followed shortly after on 12th February. A total of over 50 performers took part in the concerts, all from Key Stage 2. We were delighted with a range of music from pop songs by the likes of Taylor Swift, John Lennon and Carol King, to music from across the classical music canon, with everything you can imagine in between, including jazz and film music. At the instrumental recital we had drummers, singers, woodwind players and fantastic representation from our string players. Special mention should be given to our year 3 performers for playing their first recital. It is a daunting task performing in front of over 50 adults and all your peers and all the children's attitudes were exemplary during all the rehearsals and both performances.

On 14th February during Singing Assembly we had some visitors from Leicestershire Music and LGS who came to demonstrate the French horn and the Double Bass to our children. The children were treated to performances and were given the chance to ask questions about these endangered instruments. Unfortunately, there is a national shortage of double bass and horn players, therefore there are some fantastic funded opportunities for year 5 and 6 children to trial these instruments. If you are interested in either of these instruments for your child, please do contact me or ask your child to come and see me. After the break we have House Music to look forward to the children have already signed up and started their pieces. We look forward to seeing their performances.







Dear Parents.

We are delighted to inform you that on Monday 4th, Tuesday 5th and Thursday 7th of March, our school will be running the Scholastic Book Fair again. This year's fair will offer an inspirational and diverse selection of books for children, whatever their interests, to encourage a love of reading for all ages and abilities. In addition, our school benefits from 60% commission on all purchases which in turn will allow us to purchase new books for the children to use in school.

On Monday 4th March, all children from Kinders to Year 6 will be issued with a £1 World Book Day token. As the Book Fair will be held during World Book Day week, Scholastic are allowing the children to use their tokens in exchange for £1 off the value of any book that they purchase (this will exclude stationery which will also be on sale). The children will need to keep their tokens safe and hand these over at the point of payment in exchange for the £1 discount.

The Book Fair will be open to parents and children after school on Monday 4^{th} , Tuesday 5^{th} and Thursday 7^{th} March from 3.00 pm to 4.00pm in the Pod (the grassy area indoors where the second-hand uniform shop operates). Pupils from **Linders** to Year 6 will also be able to view and purchase books during library sessions and break times over the three days. You are most welcome to come and visit and see the wonderful range of titles available.
