Expand	Write a letter to Captain Longbeard to tell him what you have been up to at school and home. You might want to invite him to visit again!	Make a map of your home and local area to show all the main features. Include physical landmarks such as beaches, hills or forests, as well as human features such as shops, farms or harbours. Where would be a good place to hide treasure?	Visit a maritime museum, boat show, lighthouse or harbour with your family. Take lots of pictures to show and talk about at school. Maybe you could interview a family member who has worked at sea or has been on a cruise, to find out about their experiences.	In the bath, use a measuring jug to measure different amounts of water. Create capacity problems and bring them into school for other children to solve.	Have a go at making some of Roald Dahl's "Revoltin' Recipes". Take some photographs and write a report to explain just how delicious it was!	Think of an alternative ending to 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. Write it, type it, draw a storyboard or even perform it and send a video to your teacher!
Creative	Make a pirate puppet. Write about all of his adventures in his pirate diary.	Make a pirate treasure chest using a lidded box and other recycled materials. What will you keep in your treasure chest?	Design and make a boat to take part in a boat race. What materials will you use? What shape will your boat be? What name will you give it?	Make a tasty looking mud pie in your garden. Decorate it with colourful leaves, twigs berries, feathers, stones or whatever looks interesting. Take a photo but please don't eat it!	Look online to find a good recipe to make your own playdough to make incredible models. Experiment with different aromas and colours.	Make your own messy potion and write about what it would taste like and what it could do to the person who drank it! Take a photo but please don't taste it yourself!
Research	Search the web or non-fiction books to find out about a famous boat or ship. Make an information book.	Visit your local library to read and borrow story and information books about the sea. Write or film a book review about your favourite.	Find and learn some pirate jokes. Practise reading them at home to perform in school and make your pirate friends laugh! Aye, that be funny!	Melting experiment. Take some containers and fill them with the same number of ice cubes. Put them in different places and see which melts first. Present your investigation in a digital format.	Find out a bit more about the artwork of Kurt Schwitters and Carl Warner. Make some more collages of your own using lots of different media and your own wild imagination!	Investigate how certain mixtures are made. What is soap made of? Or mayonnaise? Make a list of ingredients or look with a grown up online to see a factory in action.
