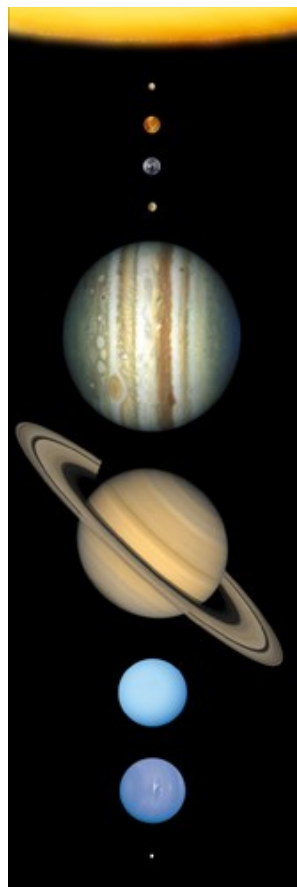














# Year 1 Lent Term 2026 Pick and Mix Grid

Expand	<p>Visit your local library and search for space-themed books. Read and talk with an adult about the books you find.</p> 	<p>Imagine you're an astronaut completing different space missions and make a mini book about your work.</p> 	<p>Share stories and poems about dinosaurs with your grown ups. Take on the role of storyteller for any younger members of your family.</p> 	<p>Hunt for ferns, yew trees, monkey puzzle trees and other prehistoric plants while you're out and about. You might even find ornamental ferns in the houses of your family and friends.</p> 
Creative	<p>With an adult, search the web for fascinating space facts and make your very own space fact book.</p> 	<p>Make a telescope from junk cardboard materials and sticky tape. Just before bedtime, use your telescope to look up at the stars.</p> 	<p>Take part in a dinosaur reading challenge. Every time you read a book at home, you'll earn a piece of a cut-up dinosaur picture. Stick them within a dinosaur outline and see how long it takes you to make the whole picture! (If you are doing this, please collect your dinosaur pieces from your teacher)</p> 	<p>Work with an adult to produce a dinosaur movie or show using toys, puppets or models. Evergreen bushes and a rocky or dusty area of your garden or local park would make perfect film sets!</p> 
Research	<p>Ask an adult to help you find the names of all the people who have walked on the Moon. There are 12 of them!</p> 	<p>With an adult, explore the Hubble Space Telescope website. Check out the amazing gallery images!</p> 	<p>Find non-fiction books at home (or in the local library) about dinosaurs. Bring them to school to share.</p> 	<p>Watch the birds in your garden or local park. Look at them closely with binoculars. Do you think they walk like dinosaurs?</p>
