Expand	We are studying coastlines. Choose a British seaside town and research it's history and development; any information about coastal features and the tourism trade.	Design a menu for an Ancient Greek restaurant. Invent a name, include options for courses and decorations. What entertainment will you provide to amuse your diners e.g. music, poetry, jokes!	Talk to a family member about their dreams or goals when they were your age. Did they achieve them? How? This could be as a video interview, a presentation or a poster	Make an iMovie introducing yourself and your family to your French pen pal, speaking in French.	We will be studying Macbeth this term—find out about a DIFFERENT play written by William Shakespeare— think about the plot/ characters/performance. Present your work in any way you choose.	Find out how lighting technicians in theatres produce different coloured lights and effects on stage, using coloured filters and lasers.
Creative	Use your creative skills to make a coastline—it could be in a shoe box lid for example, show the features of a coastline: headland/ stacks/caves/beach.	Produce a creative piece of work about a Greek God or Monster. Eg. A sculpture, mask, painting, collage...	Read a Bible story you have not covered in lessons. Can you act it out and record yourself, produce a newspaper report or draw a cartoon strip? Record it either with video, audio or using notation.	Set up your own 'who dunnit' murder mystery scene, leaving clues for others to solve. This can be a photograph, drawing or film clip. NO REAL CRIMES NEED TO BE COMMITTED!
