Expand	<p>Choose a country in Africa or Asia and find out its flag, languages spoken, popular food, popular music and the most popular sport. Present your findings as a poster.</p> <p>Research Buddhist symbols and then create your own symbol that shows how unique you are. You could present this on a shield, a flag or anything that shows your creativity and personality.</p>	<p>Make a map of your home and local area to show all the main features. Include physical landmarks such as hills or forests, as well as human features such as shops, farms or harbours.</p> <p>Research countries and Islands across the U.K or the World. Then design your own country. What would the name be? What would the flag look like? What human and physical features would there be? Draw a map.</p>
Creative	<p>Conduct a plant study, grow two or three different types of seeds or bulbs. Keep a log of your scientific observations (you could draw or write these) to show the changes in the plants over a 2-week period. Take photographs to show your classmates.</p> <p>Use your sewing skills, or learn a new skill (such as knitting, crochet or cross stitch) to make a book mark, picture or coaster. Can you include the running stitch skill we've learnt and a new stitch you've learnt from a family member or friend?</p>	<p>Go on a minibeast safari with your family. Investigate your garden, local park or woodland to search for wriggly and crawly creatures! Take photos or draw any minibeasts you find, then use your knowledge to identify them.</p> <p>Watch Antz, A Bug's Life or Epic with your family. Make a comic strip that shows part of the film or write a review and include a star rating.</p> <p>Research different types of spiders, then a letter to Miss Muffet and explain why she shouldn't be scared of spiders. Look for information online and in nonfiction books to support your ideas.</p> <p>Research and junk model an insect or mini beast. As a challenge can you make part of your model move? Perhaps make an iMovie, stop motion or video animation of your insect.</p>
